## A Miracle of the Eucharist

(2nd in a series)

Not all Eucharistic miracles happened 'long ago and far away.' Ascension Day, May 8, 1902, the French-speaking island of Martinique. The unquiet volcano Mount Pelée erupts, spewing molten rock and hot ash. Downslope, the island's capital city of Saint-Pierre is uneasy but thinks itself safely distant.

The inhabitants of a small village right next to Pelée's summit, who have a strong devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, rush to their parish church to beg protection from Our Lady of Deliverance. The priest gives general absolution and then exposes the Blessed Sacrament for public adoration. A woman cries out, "The Sacred Heart of Jesus is in the host!" Large numbers of people witness the apparition.

Then the mountain explodes. Amid a thunderous rain of molten boulders, a 1000° pyroclastic cloud hurtles downslope onto Saint-Pierre. 26,000 die.

The village of Morne-Rouge teeters precariously on what's left of the summit. The church is untouched, the apparition lingers. Not one person is injured.

Let's get to know a little about our **2010 Bazaar Jubilarians**. Where they are now, what they've been doing ever since they "graduated" from St. Martin and what roads they have traveled in the religious life:

**Sister Celine Jonas, OSF** has been a Franciscan Sister of Little Falls for 70 years. One of 12 children, she was born in rural St Martin to the late Anton and Mary Ohmann Jonas. Her work over the years was mostly in hospitals. She's now living in retirement at the Franciscan motherhouse at Little Falls.

**Father Sylvester Kleinschmidt** has been a priest of the Diocese of St. Cloud for 60 years. He and his twin sister were the oldest of the seven children of the late Joseph and Margaret Laubach Kleinschmidt in rural St. Martin. He served in various parishes of the diocese through the years and now lives in retirement in Sauk Centre.

**Sister Bernadette Weber, OSB** has been a professed Benedictine sister, St. Joseph, MN for 60 years. She is one of the eleven children of the late Bernard and Louise Arceneau Weber of rural St. Martin. The family has had 6 Benedictines in the family, 2 priests and 4 sisters. Sister was a parochial school teacher for many years, specializing in special education. At this time she lives at and works for her Monastery in St. Joseph.

**Sister Ann Arceneau, OSB** has been a professed Benedictine sister for 60 years. She is one of 8 children of the late Daniel and Catherine Ehresman Arceneau of rural St. Martin. One of her sisters is also a Benedictine sister, St. Joseph. She was a parochial school teacher most of her life and at this time lives at and works for her Monastery in St. Joseph.

**Brother Robert Mandernach, OSC** has been a professed Crosier brother for 50 years. He is one of 12 children of the late Peter and Catherine Lieser Mandernach of rural St. Martin. He has a brother who is a religious brother and three Benedictine sisters at St. Joseph, MN. His assignments over the years were mostly at Crosier priories in the USA, but he also gave some time to the Crosier mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. At the present time he lives and works for the Crosier Priory, Onamia, MN.

**Sister Dorothy Noll, OSB** has been a professed Sister of St. Benedict at St. Joseph, MN for 50 years. She was one of the six children born to the late Peter and Tecla Noll of St. Martin. Through the years she served her Order and Church in various parishes. At this time she lives at and works for her Monastery in St. Joseph.

**Sister Lorraine Olmscheid, OSF** has been a Franciscan Sister, Little Falls, MN for 50 years. She is one of the ten children born to the late Frank and Elizabeth Wulfuekuhle Olmscheid of rural St. Martin. Over the years she has been a homemaker for her fellow Franciscan sisters in parishes, etc. At the present time she lives in St. Paul, MN and works for the poor with the Sisters of St. Joseph, St. Paul.

Our parish is indeed fortunate to be able to celebrate lists of Jubilarians like this year after year. For 152 years they have set the "gold standard" for other parishes to try to emulate—and for us to try to live up to now. When it comes to vocations to the priesthood and religious life, it always begins at home. Always.

## How HEAVEN Works

An old tale gives two images that contrast the difference between heaven and hell. The image of hell is this:

There is a large banquet hall. The room is prepared with all the finest that money can buy. The table and chairs are made of oak from the Black Forest of Germany. The linen is handmade by European craftsmen. The plates and saucers are bone china and the glassware is Waterford crystal. The meal itself has been prepared by the world's best chefs. The guests are present and are dressed in their finest attire. The only odd thing about this scene is the silverware utensils which, made of sterling silver, are very long, heavy and cumbersome. When the guests sit down and begin to eat, some people are not able to lift any of the utensils. Those that are able to lift the fork, knife or spoon cannot maneuver it so as to get anything to eat. Banqueters begin to bump into each other in their attempt to eat. Frustration, anger and even violence is the result. In the end no one gets anything to eat.

The image of heaven is a little bit different:

The same banquet hall is adorned in the same way; the Black Forest oak, linen, bone china, Waterford crystal and fine food are all present. Even the large and cumbersome silverware is present. There is a different group of guests who are dressed very smartly. Somehow, somewhere these banqueters have learned an important lesson. They quickly realize that the utensils will not allow them to feed themselves. Thus, as they sit down to eat, those who are able to lift the utensils pick up some food and maneuver it so as to feed a neighbor. When necessary two people lift a fork and feed a third person, who, in turn, asks help to feed those who fed him. In the end all eat well; each is satisfied, because they have learned to feed each other.
