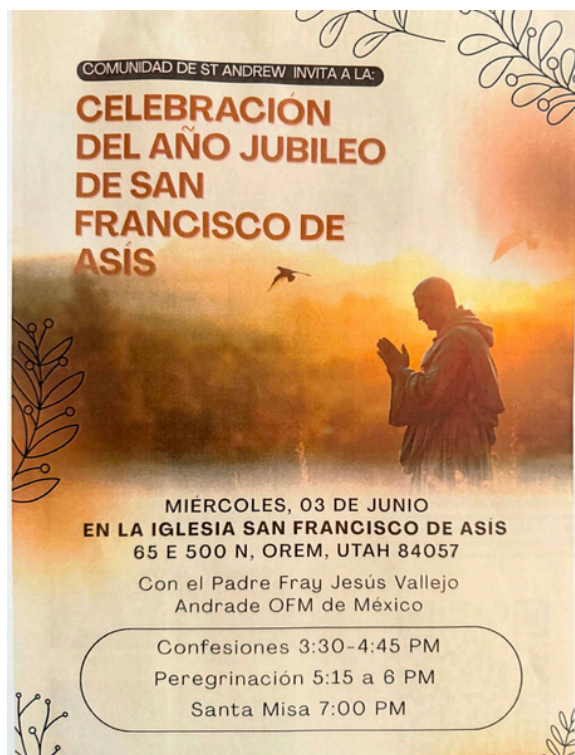

BAPTISMS
Parents must be registered parishioners for a minimum of six months. Please note that appointments are available by appointment only, and preparation classes are required.

FIRST COMMUNION
Students must be enrolled in religious education classes for at least two years and currently attending First Communion class.

CONFIRMATION
Students must be enrolled in religious education classes for at least two years and currently attending Confirmation class.

MARRIAGE
Preparation must begin a minimum of six months before a proposed wedding date at our church or any other church. Dates will be finalized after consultation with the pastor.

Mass Intentions

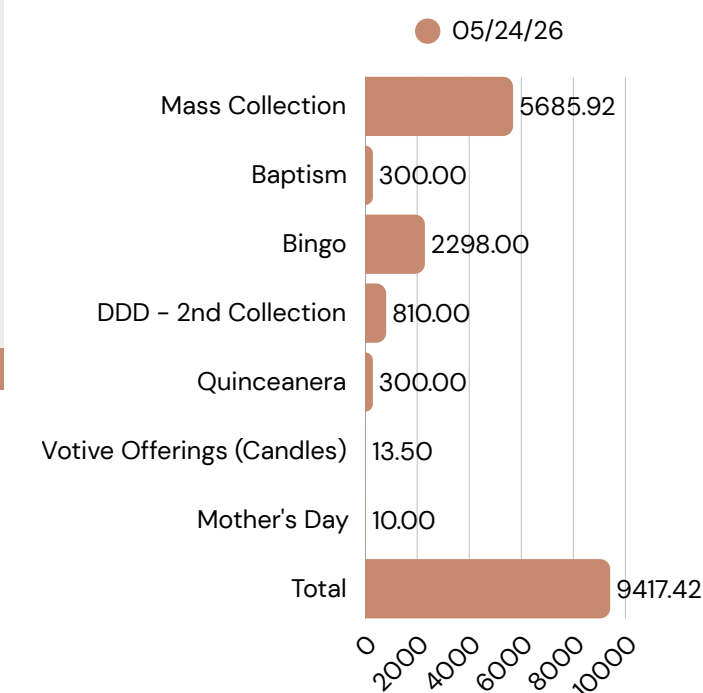

Pastoral Message

Bulletin Series XL Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity celebrates one of the most fundamental teachings of our Catholic faith. It is among the first doctrines we learn in catechism, yet it remains one of the deepest and most important mysteries of our faith.

As Catholics, we begin and end our prayers with the Sign of the Cross. We do so reverently because in that simple gesture we profess our belief in the Holy Trinity: One God in three Divine Persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The mystery of the Trinity is not easy to explain because it goes beyond what our human minds can fully understand. It requires faith. Through faith, we accept truths that cannot be seen with our eyes but are revealed to us by God.

One simple way to illustrate this mystery is through a mathematical analogy: 1 × 1 × 1 = 1. While no analogy can perfectly explain God, it helps us understand that the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are distinct Persons, yet they are one God.

All of us were baptized using the Trinitarian formula. When the priest or deacon baptized us, he said:

"I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Each Divine Person has a unique mission in the work of salvation.

The **Father** is the Creator, the source of all life and existence.

The **Son**, Jesus Christ, is our Savior and Redeemer, who suffered, died, and rose again to save us from our sins.

The **Holy Spirit**, whom we celebrated last Sunday on Pentecost, is the life of the Church. He is the Advocate, the Paraclete, and the "Ruah" in Hebrew—the Breath of God. The Holy Spirit guides us, strengthens us, and helps us make good and holy choices each day.

Dear friends, let us constantly entrust ourselves to the Most Holy Trinity. When you wake up each morning, do not forget to make the Sign of the Cross with devotion and faith. It is a simple but powerful prayer that says:

"Lord, I entrust myself to You today."

Offer to God your work, your joys, your plans, and even your sufferings. Like the Morning Offering prayer, let us say:

"Lord, I offer You all my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of this day."

May the Father protect us, may the Son save us, and may the Holy Spirit guide us always.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Fr. Robin

Pastoral Message

Serie del Boletín XL Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad

La Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad celebra una de las enseñanzas más fundamentales de nuestra fe católica. Es una de las primeras doctrinas que aprendemos en el catecismo, pero al mismo tiempo es uno de los misterios más profundos e importantes de nuestra fe.

Como católicos, comenzamos y terminamos nuestras oraciones con la Señal de la Cruz. Lo hacemos con reverencia porque en ese sencillo gesto profesamos nuestra fe en la Santísima Trinidad: un solo Dios en tres Personas Divinas: el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo.

El misterio de la Trinidad no es fácil de explicar porque supera nuestra capacidad humana de comprenderlo plenamente. Requiere fe. Por medio de la fe aceptamos verdades que no podemos ver con nuestros ojos, pero que Dios nos ha revelado.

Una manera sencilla de ilustrar este misterio es mediante una analogía matemática: 1 × 1 × 1 = 1. Aunque ninguna comparación puede explicar perfectamente a Dios, esta nos ayuda a entender que el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo son Personas distintas, pero un solo Dios.

Todos nosotros fuimos bautizados con la fórmula trinitaria. Cuando el sacerdote o diácono nos bautizó, dijo:

"Yo te bautizo en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo."

Cada Persona Divina tiene una misión particular en la obra de la salvación.

El **Padre** es el Creador, el origen de toda vida y de toda existencia.

El **Hijo**, Jesucristo, es nuestro Salvador y Redentor, quien sufrió, murió y resucitó para salvarnos de nuestros pecados.

El **Espíritu Santo**, a quien celebramos el domingo pasado en Pentecostés, es la vida de la Iglesia. Él es el Paráclito, el Abogado, y el **Ruah** en hebreo, que significa el Soplo de Dios. El Espíritu Santo nos guía, nos fortalece y nos ayuda a tomar buenas decisiones cada día.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, encomendémonos constantemente a la Santísima Trinidad. Cuando se despierten por la mañana, no olviden hacer la Señal de la Cruz con devoción y fe. Es una oración sencilla pero poderosa que expresa:

"Señor, hoy me pongo en tus manos."

Ofrezcan a Dios su trabajo, sus alegrías, sus proyectos y también sus sufrimientos. Como rezamos en la Oración de la Ofrenda de la Mañana:

"Señor, te ofrezco mis oraciones, obras, alegrías y sufrimientos de este día."

Que el Padre nos proteja, que el Hijo nos salve y que el Espíritu Santo nos guíe siempre.

En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo. Amén. Pbro Robin
