BAPTISMS

FIRST COMMUNION
Students must be enrolled in religious education classes for at least two years and currently attending First Communion class.

CONFIRMATION
Students must be enrolled in religious education classes for at least two years and currently attending Confirmation class.

MARRIAGE
Preparation must begin a minimum of six months before a proposed wedding date at our church or any other church. Dates will be finalized after consultation with the pastor.

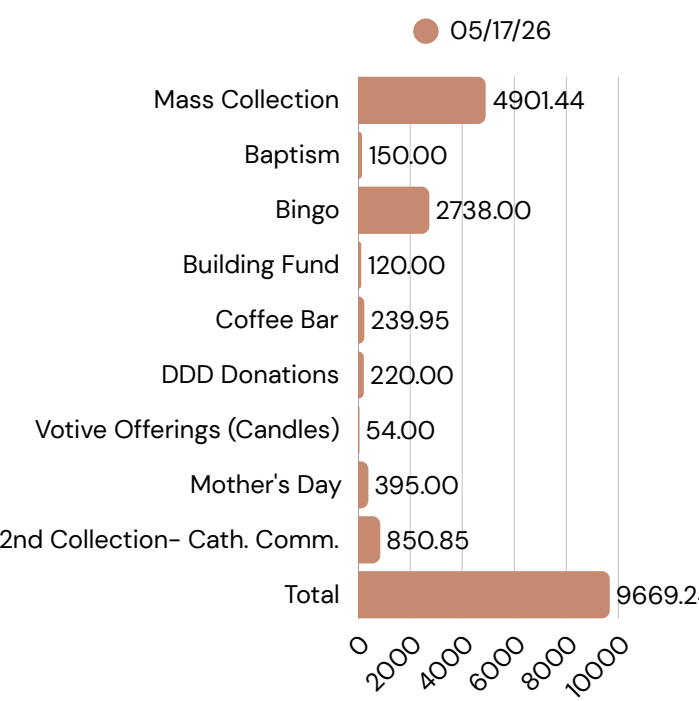

Bulletin Series XXXIX – Pentecost Sunday

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. The frightened disciples were gathered behind closed doors, but when the Holy Spirit came upon them, they were transformed. They received courage, strength, wisdom, and peace. They went out into the world boldly proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The same Holy Spirit received by the Apostles is also given to us through Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation. The Holy Spirit continues to guide, protect, and sanctify the Church today.

The Church teaches us about the **Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit:**

- Wisdom
 - Understanding
 - Counsel
 - Fortitude
 - Knowledge
 - Piety
 - Fear of the Lord
- These gifts help us live as faithful Christians.

For example, the **Fear of the Lord** does not mean being afraid of God as if He only wants to punish us whenever we sin or fail. Yes, God is just, but He is also loving, merciful, and compassionate.

Fear of the Lord means having deep respect, trust, and reverence for God. It means choosing to stay close to Him, living a prayerful life, and always desiring to be on the side of God rather than on the side of sin.

Wisdom helps us see life according to God’s ways and not only according to worldly thinking.

Understanding helps us comprehend the teachings of Christ and the truths of our faith more deeply.

Knowledge helps us recognize God’s presence in creation and in our daily lives.

Counsel helps us make good and moral decisions according to God’s will.

Fortitude gives us courage to remain faithful during difficulties, sufferings, and temptations.

Piety helps us love God as our Father and inspires devotion, prayer, and love for others.

The Holy Spirit also produces visible fruits in our lives. These are called the **Fruits of the Holy Spirit:** love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

When we truly allow the Holy Spirit to work within us, our lives begin to change. We become more loving, forgiving, patient, and compassionate. The Holy Spirit helps us become better Christians, better families, and better disciples of Christ.

Today let us pray: “Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love.”

May the Holy Spirit continue to guide us every day and help us live holy and faithful lives.

La **Sabiduría** nos ayuda a ver la vida según los caminos de Dios y no solamente según el pensamiento del mundo.

El **Entendimiento** nos ayuda a comprender más profundamente las enseñanzas de Cristo y las verdades de nuestra fe.

El **Consejo** nos ayuda a tomar buenas decisiones según la voluntad de Dios.
