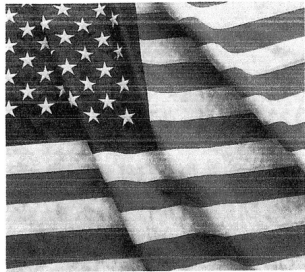

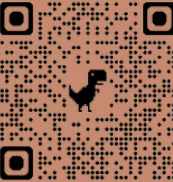

BAPTISMS

FIRST COMMUNION

CONFIRMATION
Students must be enrolled in religious education classes for at least two years and currently attending Confirmation class.

MARRIAGE
Preparation must begin a minimum of six months before a proposed wedding date at our church or any other church. Dates will be finalized after consultation with the pastor.

Twenty–Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
Matthew 18:15–20 — Fraternal Correction

Fraternal correction is one of the cornerstones of the Christian faith. Although correction is personal, it is never merely a private matter; it always has a community dimension.

From this, we can draw some important consequences: **we cannot think, speak, or act as if our thoughts, our words, and our actions were exclusively “my business” or “my problem.”** For better or for worse, the conduct of one person affects everyone.

Jesus reminds us in today’s Gospel that we have a responsibility toward one another. When we see someone going in the wrong direction, Christian love calls us not to ignore it, but to approach that person with charity, humility, and concern.

Fraternal correction is not about judging or condemning another person. It is about helping one another grow in holiness and return to the right path. At the same time, we must be humble enough to accept correction when someone lovingly points out our own mistakes.

Our words and actions always have an effect on others. A kind word can encourage someone; a hurtful word can discourage. A good example can inspire others; a bad example can lead others away from God.

That is why Jesus says, **“Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.”** We are not Christians alone. We belong to a community, and what each of us does contributes to the life of that community.

May we learn to correct one another with love, receive correction with humility, and always seek what is good for one another and for the whole community.

Mateo 18, 15–20 — La corrección fraterna

La **corrección** fraterna es una de las piedras angulares de la fe cristiana. Aunque la corrección es algo personal, no deja de tener una dimensión comunitaria.

De esto podemos sacar algunas consecuencias importantes: **no podemos pensar, hablar o actuar como si nuestros pensamientos, nuestras palabras y nuestras acciones fueran exclusivamente “mi asunto” o “mi problema”.** Para bien o para mal, la conducta de una sola persona afecta a todos.

Jesús nos recuerda en el Evangelio de hoy que tenemos una responsabilidad unos con otros. Cuando vemos que alguien está tomando un camino equivocado, el amor cristiano nos invita a no ignorarlo, sino a acercarnos a esa persona con caridad, humildad y preocupación.

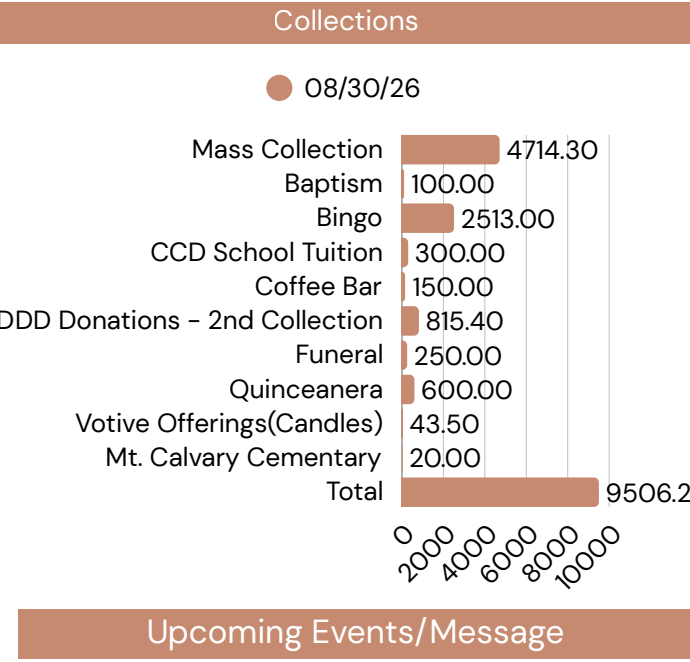
La corrección fraterna no significa juzgar ni condenar a otra persona. Significa ayudar al otro a crecer en santidad y a regresar al camino correcto. Al mismo tiempo, debemos ser humildes para aceptar la corrección cuando alguien nos señala con amor nuestros propios errores.

Nuestras palabras y nuestras acciones siempre tienen un efecto en los demás. Una palabra amable puede animar a alguien; una palabra que hiere puede desanimarlo. Un buen ejemplo puede inspirar a otros; un mal ejemplo puede alejarlos de Dios.

Por eso Jesús dice: **“Donde dos o tres están reunidos en mi nombre, allí estoy yo en medio de ellos.”** No somos cristianos solos. Perteneceemos a una comunidad, y lo que cada uno de nosotros hace contribuye a la vida de esa comunidad.

Pidamos al Señor que nos enseñe a **corregirnos unos a otros con amor, aceptar la corrección con humildad y buscar siempre el bien de los demás y de toda nuestra comunidad.**
