## Pastor's Message

Brothers & Sisters,

In today's Gospel, a scribe asks Jesus a basic religious question: "What should I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus directs the scribe's attention to the Sacred Scriptures. The Scriptural answer is, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." However, to the scribe the word "neighbor" means another scribe or Pharisee – never a Samaritan or a Gentile. The scribe asks for clarification of the word "neighbor." To illustrate his point, Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan. This parable clearly indicates that a "neighbor" is anyone who needs help. Perhaps, the better question is not to ask, "Who is my neighbor?" but instead to ask, "Am I a good neighbor to others?"

Jesus invites us to show our love to others, in our own home, in school, in the workplace, in our parish, and in the neighborhood, as the Good Samaritan did. We are good neighbors when we are people of generosity, kindness, and mercy toward all who are suffering. If a person has a need that we can and should meet, that person is our neighbor. Every time we see a person in need, we become a neighbor; we become a minister with a ministry.

In reflecting on this image of the Good Samaritan this week I was thinking of all the outreach programs that our parish has had over the last year. Our parish provided several vanloads of warm clothing to The Road Home, a center that offers all types of material support to the homeless of our city. We raised about \$5000 and donated 2 truckloads of baby supplies for the Pregnancy Resource Center of Utah. Our Council of Catholic Women, with the help of the Knights, gave over \$300 in gift cards, \$140 in cash, numerous socks, underwear, pants, and some shoes to the Veterans Volunteer Services. Both our Knights of Columbus and the Hispanic Community have cooked up a storm to raise money for our parish and its ministries. We exceeded our goal for the Diocesan Development Drive (DDD) this year to support the many outreach programs in our diocese that depend on that funding.

Over the last few weeks, I have highlighted some of our parish's volunteer groups. This week I would like to shine the spotlight on the group that helps out in the St. Vincent de Paul Dinning Hall that provides two meals every day for those who live on the streets of our city. Let's thank our St. Martin de Porres' parish group who volunteer to offer food and drink to our fellow brothers and sisters every first Thursday of each month. I understand that our parish has one of the largest groups but we are always open for more volunteers. Please contact Dave Mullen if you are interested.

Great work everybody!

## Mensaje del pastor

Hermanos y hermanas,

En el Evangelio de hoy, un escriba le hace a Jesús una pregunta religiosa básica: “¿Qué debo hacer para heredar la vida eterna?” Jesús dirige la atención del escriba a las Sagradas Escrituras. La respuesta bíblica es: “Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con todo tu ser, con todas tus fuerzas y con toda tu mente, y a tu prójimo como a ti mismo”. Sin embargo, para el escriba la palabra “prójimo” significa otro escriba o fariseo, nunca un samaritano o un gentil. El escriba pide aclaración de la palabra “prójimo”. Para ilustrar su punto, Jesús cuenta la parábola del Buen Samaritano. Esta parábola indica claramente que un “prójimo” es cualquier persona que necesita ayuda. Quizás, la mejor pregunta es no preguntar, “¿Quién es mi prójimo?” sino más bien preguntar: “¿Soy un buen prójimo para los demás?”

Jesús nos invita a mostrar nuestro amor a los demás, en nuestra propia casa, en la escuela, en el trabajo, en nuestra parroquia y en el barrio, como lo hizo el Buen Samaritano. Somos buenos vecinos cuando somos personas generosas, bondadosas y misericordiosas con todos los que sufren. Si una persona tiene una necesidad que podemos y debemos satisfacer, esa persona es nuestro prójimo. Cada vez que vemos a una persona en necesidad, nos hacemos prójimos; nos convertimos en un ministro con un ministerio.

Al reflexionar sobre esta imagen del Buen Samaritano esta semana, estaba pensando en todos los programas de extensión que nuestra parroquia ha tenido durante el último año. Nuestra parroquia brindó varias camionetas llenas de ropa de abrigo a The Road Home, un centro que ofrece todo tipo de apoyo material a las personas sin hogar de nuestra ciudad. Recaudamos alrededor de \$5000 y donamos 2 camiones llenos de suministros para bebés para el Centro de Recursos para el Embarazo de Utah. Nuestro Consejo de Mujeres Católicas, con la ayuda de los Caballeros, entregó más de \$300 en tarjetas de regalo, \$140 en efectivo, numerosos calcetines, ropa interior, pantalones y algunos zapatos a los Servicios Voluntarios de Veteranos. Tanto nuestros Caballeros de Colón como la comunidad hispana han preparado una tormenta para recaudar dinero para nuestra parroquia y sus ministerios. Superamos nuestra meta para la Campaña de Desarrollo Diocesano (DDD, por sus siglas en inglés) este año para apoyar los muchos programas de extensión en nuestra diócesis que dependen de esa financiación.

Durante las últimas semanas, he destacado algunos de los grupos de voluntarios de nuestra parroquia. Esta semana me gustaría destacar el grupo que ayuda en el Comedor St. Vincent de Paul que brinda dos comidas todos los días para quienes viven en las calles de nuestra ciudad. Agradecemos a nuestro grupo parroquial de San Martín de Porres que se ofrecen como voluntarios para ofrecer alimentos y bebidas a nuestros hermanos y hermanas cada primer jueves de cada mes. Entiendo que nuestra parroquia tiene uno de los grupos más grandes, pero siempre estamos abiertos a recibir más voluntarios. Póngase en contacto con Dave Mullen si está interesado.
