Pastor's Message

Brothers and Sisters,

On Saturday, we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with the students in our Faith Formation program. Many thanks to our catechists, Deacon Joaquin, Lupe Vazquez Gonzales, Robin Marvive, and Robert Woods for the wonderful job they did in helping our young people prepare to take this step in their journey of faith. Congratulations to them and may the Holy Spirit continue to guide and protect them.

In the continuing series of reflections on the Mass for the year of Eucharistic Revival, we've been looking at each part of the Mass and trying to understand what we do and why. For this reflection, we will continue to focus on the Communion Rite.

Most of you would agree that sharing in the Eucharist is the high point of the entire celebration. The Church does teach that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life. But, Communion in the absence of the rest of the Mass doesn't quite make sense either. God calls us to covenant in the Liturgy of the Word, and we respond in the Eucharistic Prayer. Each of us then comes forward in the Communion procession to renew our participation in that covenant in the Body and Blood of Christ.

We process to the eucharistic table to "take and eat." When receiving Communion, we should make a simple bow of the head and respond "Amen" when the Priest, deacon, or minister presents the Host and says, "the Body of Christ." As soon as you receive the Host, you must consume it. Again, it is a very simple ritual action, but it is filled with meaning. We are not only saying "yes" to the presence of Christ in the host, the Body of Christ; but we are also saying "yes" to the presence of Christ in the Church, the Body of Christ. Further, we are saying "yes" to the fact that we are the Body of Christ in the world as we share this holy meal.

Our song throughout the Communion procession expresses our unity of spirit through the unity of our voices. It gives evidence of our joy. And our singing makes the procession to Communion truly an act of community rather than a line-up of private individuals (GIRM 86).

When the Act of Communion is over, we pray silently for a moment or two, then stand and collect our prayers together in The Prayer After Communion.

We are then ready to take what we have received in this celebration of Mass out into our daily lives and the world in which we live.

Announcements about the works of Christ in the parish and community may be made. The priest blesses the congregation with the sign of the cross that we began with. Then we are sent forth in peace to bring into the world the Word of God that we have heard and the unity and reconciliation renewed in us by our communion. We are to take Christ from the table to the world. Or better, because we have shared in the Body and Blood of Christ in our communion, we now ARE Christ's presence in the world as we "go in peace to love and serve the Lord."

Mensaje del párroco

El sábado celebramos el Sacramento de la Confirmación con los estudiantes en nuestro programa de Formación en la Fe. Muchas gracias a nuestros catequistas, Diácono Joaquín, Lupe Vázquez Gonzales, Robin Marvive y Robert Woods por el maravilloso trabajo que hicieron para ayudar a nuestros jóvenes a prepararse para dar este paso en su viaje de fe. Felicidades a ellos y que el Espíritu Santo los siga guiando y protegiendo.

En la serie continua de reflexiones sobre la Misa para el año del Avivamiento Eucarístico, hemos estado analizando cada parte de la Misa y tratando de comprender qué hacemos y por qué. Para esta reflexión, continuaremos enfocándonos en el Rito de la Comunión.

La mayoría de ustedes estaría de acuerdo en que compartir la Eucaristía es el punto culminante de toda la celebración. La Iglesia enseña que la Eucaristía es la fuente y cumbre de nuestra vida cristiana. Pero, la Comunión en ausencia del resto de la Misa tampoco tiene mucho sentido. Dios nos llama a la alianza en la Liturgia de la Palabra, y nosotros respondemos en la Plegaria Eucarística. Luego, cada uno de nosotros avanza en la procesión de la Comunión para renovar nuestra participación en ese pacto en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo.

Nos dirigimos a la mesa eucarística para "tomar y comer". Al recibir la Comunión, debemos hacer una simple inclinación de cabeza y responder "Amén" cuando el Sacerdote, diácono o ministro presenta la Hostia y dice, "el Cuerpo de Cristo". Tan pronto como recibas la Hostia, debes consumirla. Nuevamente, es una acción ritual muy simple, pero está llena de significado. No sólo decimos "sí" a la presencia de Cristo en la hostia, el Cuerpo de Cristo; pero también estamos diciendo "sí" a la presencia de Cristo en la Iglesia, el Cuerpo de Cristo. Además, estamos diciendo "sí" al hecho de que somos el Cuerpo de Cristo en el mundo al compartir esta santa comida.

Nuestro canto durante la procesión de la Comunión expresa nuestra unidad de espíritu a través de la unidad de nuestras voces. Da evidencia de nuestra alegría. Y nuestro canto hace que la procesión a la Comunión sea verdaderamente un acto de comunidad en lugar de una fila de individuos privados (GIRM 86).

Cuando termina el Acto de Comunión, oramos en silencio por un momento o dos, luego nos ponemos de pie y juntamos nuestras oraciones en La Oración Después de la Comunión.

Entonces estamos listos para llevar lo que hemos recibido en esta celebración de la Misa a nuestra vida diaria y al mundo en el que vivimos.

Se pueden hacer anuncios sobre las obras de Cristo en la parroquia y la comunidad.

El sacerdote bendice a la congregación con la señal de la cruz con la que comenzamos.

Entonces somos enviados en paz para llevar al mundo la Palabra de Dios que hemos oído y la unidad y la reconciliación renovadas en nosotros por nuestra comunión. Debemos llevar a Cristo de la mesa al mundo. O mejor, porque hemos compartido el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo en nuestra comunión, ahora SOMOS la presencia de Cristo en el mundo mientras "vamos en paz a amar y servir al Señor".

San Martín de Porres - ¡Ruega por nosotros!
