Pastor’s Message

Dear Brothers and sisters,

Next weekend the Knights of Columbus will be holding a membership drive. As many of you know, I am proud to be the Utah State Chaplain for the Knights of Columbus. In my letter this week, I would like to tell you about who the Knights are, what they do, and why it is important.

The Knights of Columbus was founded by Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney, a parish priest in New Haven, Ct, in 1882 as a society to bring financial aid and assistance to the sick, disabled, and needy and their families. Because of religious and ethnic discrimination, Catholics in the late 19th century were regularly excluded from labor unions, popular fraternal organizations, and other organized groups that provided such social services.

The organization's founding principles are Fraternity, Patriotism, Charity, and Unity. It has grown to support refugee relief, Catholic Education, local parishes and dioceses, and global Catholic social and political causes.

Charity is the foremost important principle of the Knights of Columbus. At the 2023 convention (Which I attended in Florida), Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announced that the organization had donated \$185 million and 49 million volunteer hours toward charity projects in 2022. Charitable activities include support for refugees, aid for victims of natural disasters, and advocating Catholic ethics, such as the preservation of families and the right to life. During times of war, the Order sends aid to refugees. Between 2014 and 2018, the Knights gave more than \$2 million to provide food, shelter, clothing, and medical care to persecuted Christians in the Middle East. The Knights donated \$250,000 in 2018 to help refugees crossing over the Mexico–United States border who were seeking asylum in the United States and have since expanded the program. The Knights of Columbus has donated more than \$600 million to those with intellectual and physical disabilities and has been supporting the Special Olympics since its inception.

In our parish, the Knights are at work in a variety of ways. They are generous with their time cutting the grass, clearing the snow, helping with BINGO, cleaning the hall, and maintaining the Church buildings (and there are many other things they do too). They are an amazing group of guys. I joined the Knights in 1996 during my first assignment in the Diocese of Phoenix and every parish I have worked at since then has a core group of faithful brother Knights who serve. There are over 2 million Knights world-wide, the next one could be you!

Annual Fall Clean-Up; Saturday, October 5 from 9 am - 2 pm. It is that time of year again! We as a parish family will be working together to attend to the many maintenance needs of our church building, grounds, and rectory. Last year was a great success as we got to know one another better and got things ready for winter.

Below is a list of what needs to be done. It is a start, there is much more to do.

-Landscape work which includes cutting down shrubs and dead branches from trees, digging out tree suckers in the backfield, general raking and cleaning up fallen pine needles in the parking lot islands, and weeding all the flower beds around the church and rectory.

-Curbing needs to be painted.

-Pews and other woodwork need to be cleaned and conditioned.

-The rectory needs shrubs trimmed and branches trimmed.

-Windows need to be washed inside and out.

-Volunteers should bring their own gloves, safety glasses, and appropriate footwear.

-We also ask everyone to bring tools such as chainsaws, rakes, brooms, wheel barrels, and shovels.

-If you would like to participate but cannot help with the physical labor, please join us by bringing breakfast, snacks, and lunch items! They are a great addition!

-There is a sign-up sheet in the back of the church. We look forward to and thank you for your help, ahead of time!

Mensaje del pastor

Queridos hermanos y hermanas

Hermanos y hermanas,

El próximo fin de semana, los Caballeros de Colón llevarán a cabo una campaña de afiliación. Como muchos de ustedes saben, estoy orgulloso de ser el capellán del estado de Utah para los Caballeros de Colón. En mi carta de esta semana, me gustaría contarles quiénes son los Caballeros, qué hacen y por qué es importante.

Los Caballeros de Colón fueron fundados por el Beato Padre Michael McGivney, párroco de New Haven, Connecticut, en 1882 como una sociedad para brindar ayuda financiera y asistencia a los enfermos, discapacitados y necesitados y a sus familias. Debido a la discriminación religiosa y étnica, los católicos a fines del siglo XIX eran excluidos regularmente de los sindicatos, las organizaciones fraternales populares y otros grupos organizados que brindaban dichos servicios sociales.

Los principios fundadores de la organización son la fraternidad, el patriotismo, la caridad y la unidad. Ha crecido para apoyar la ayuda a los refugiados, la educación católica, las parroquias y diócesis locales y las causas sociales y políticas católicas globales.

La caridad es el principio más importante de los Caballeros de Colón. En la convención de 2023 (a la que asistí en Florida), el Caballero Supremo Patrick Kelly anunció que la organización había donado 185 millones de dólares y 49 millones de horas de voluntariado para proyectos de caridad en 2022. Las actividades caritativas incluyen el apoyo a los refugiados, la ayuda a las víctimas de desastres naturales y la defensa de la ética católica, como la preservación de las familias y el derecho a la vida. En tiempos de guerra, la Orden envía ayuda a los refugiados. Entre 2014 y 2018, los Caballeros donaron más de 2 millones de dólares para proporcionar alimentos, refugio, ropa y atención médica a los cristianos perseguidos en Oriente Medio. Los Caballeros donaron 250.000 dólares en 2018 para ayudar a los refugiados que cruzaban la frontera entre México y Estados Unidos y buscaban asilo en Estados Unidos y desde entonces han ampliado el programa. Los Caballeros de Colón han donado más de 600 millones de dólares a personas con discapacidades intelectuales y físicas y han apoyado las Olimpiadas Especiales desde su inicio.

En nuestra parroquia, los Caballeros trabajan de diversas maneras. Son generosos con su tiempo cortando el césped, quitando la nieve, ayudando con el BINGO, limpiando el salón y manteniendo los edificios de la Iglesia (y hay muchas otras cosas que también hacen). Son un grupo de personas increíbles. Me uní a los Caballeros en 1996 durante mi primera asignación en la Diócesis de Phoenix y cada parroquia en la que he trabajado desde entonces tiene un grupo

central de fieles hermanos Caballeros que sirven. Hay más de 2 millones de Caballeros en todo el mundo, ¡el próximo podrías ser tú!

Limpieza anual de otoño; sábado 5 de octubre de 9 am a 2 pm. ¡Es esa época del año nuevamente! Como familia parroquial, trabajaremos juntos para atender las muchas necesidades de mantenimiento de nuestro edificio de la iglesia, los jardines y la rectoría. El año pasado fue un gran éxito ya que nos conocimos mejor y preparamos todo para el invierno.

A continuación se muestra una lista de lo que se debe hacer. Es un comienzo, hay mucho más por hacer.

Trabajos de jardinería que incluyen cortar arbustos y ramas muertas de los árboles, desenterrar los retoños de los árboles en el campo trasero, rastrillar y limpiar las agujas de pino caídas en las islas del estacionamiento y quitar las malas hierbas de todos los canteros de flores alrededor de la iglesia y la rectoría.

-Es necesario pintar los bordillos.

-Es necesario limpiar y acondicionar los bancos y otras piezas de madera.

-Es necesario podar los arbustos y las ramas de la rectoría.

-Es necesario lavar las ventanas por dentro y por fuera.

-Los voluntarios deben traer sus propios guantes, anteojos de seguridad y calzado adecuado.

-También les pedimos a todos que traigan herramientas como motosierras, rastrillos, escobas, carretillas y palas.

-Si desea participar pero no puede ayudar con el trabajo físico, ¡únase a nosotros trayendo desayuno, refrigerios y almuerzos! ¡Son una gran adición!

-Hay una hoja de inscripción en la parte trasera de la iglesia. ¡Esperamos su ayuda y le agradecemos de antemano!
