## **Pastor's Message**

Dear Brothers and sisters,

Today's Scripture readings describe leadership as the service of others and offer Jesus as the best example. They explain the servant leadership of Jesus, pinpointing self-sacrificing, humble, loving service as the measure of greatness in Christ's Kingdom. The Servant of the first reading intercedes with God for the people, taking upon himself their wrongdoings and accepting the punishment their sins have incurred. The second reading notes that Jesus, as God willed, became the mediator or High Priest for the people. The reading speaks of a High Priest, "able to sympathize with us in our weakness." Today's Gospel explains how Jesus accomplished the Messianic mission of saving mankind by becoming the "Suffering Servant" and challenged the disciples to become great by serving others.

To become an authentic disciple of Jesus means to put ourselves in the humble, demanding role of servant to others, and so to seek intentionally the happiness and fulfillment of those we love regardless of the cost to ourselves. There can be no success without sacrifice. We are challenged to drink the cup of Jesus by laying down our lives in humble, loving, and sacrificial service for others, just as Jesus did. We are a community of equals, and we should share in the responsibilities of being a community. No one of us possesses all that we as a community need. Our job as servant leaders is to evoke, recognize, nurture, celebrate, and help unify the gifts of the Holy Spirit at work here in our community.

The 3rd Sunday in October is World Mission Sunday. Pope Pius XI instituted this annual observance 98 years ago in 1926. This celebration gives us a chance to reflect on the importance of mission work for the life of the Church. It reminds us that we are one with the Church around the world and that we are all committed to carrying on the mission of Christ, however different our situations may be. I am especially pleased to announce this weekend that we have met our parish goal for the DDD (Diocesan Development Drive). The funds raised by the DDD support the work of the Church in our Diocese and our parish receives a rebate based on our contribution, so there is still time to give. Thank you for your generosity.

Next weekend is our Annual Fall Festival hosted by the CCW, in the parish hall. This festival features crafts, food, and unique creations for sale. Please support our CCW and local small businesses.

## Mensaje del pastor

Queridos hermanos y hermanas

Las lecturas de las Sagradas Escrituras de hoy describen el liderazgo como el servicio a los demás y ofrecen a Jesús como el mejor ejemplo. Explican el liderazgo de servicio de Jesús, señalando el servicio abnegado, humilde y amoroso como la medida de la grandeza en el Reino de Cristo. El Siervo de la primera lectura intercede ante Dios por el pueblo, tomando sobre sí sus malas acciones y aceptando el castigo que sus pecados han conllevado. La segunda lectura señala que Jesús, como Dios quiso, se convirtió en el mediador o Sumo Sacerdote para el pueblo. La lectura habla de un Sumo Sacerdote, “capaz de compadecerse de nosotros en nuestra debilidad”. El Evangelio de hoy explica cómo Jesús cumplió la misión mesiánica de salvar a la humanidad al convertirse en el “Siervo Sufriente” y desafió a los discípulos a ser grandes sirviendo a los demás.

Convertirse en un auténtico discípulo de Jesús significa ponernos en el humilde y exigente papel de siervos de los demás, y así buscar intencionalmente la felicidad y la realización de aquellos a quienes amamos sin importar el costo para nosotros mismos. No puede haber éxito sin sacrificio. Tenemos el reto de beber la copa de Jesús entregando nuestras vidas en servicio humilde, amoroso y sacrificado por los demás, tal como lo hizo Jesús. Somos una comunidad de iguales y debemos compartir las responsabilidades de ser una comunidad. Ninguno de nosotros posee todo lo que necesitamos como comunidad. Nuestro trabajo como líderes servidores es evocar, reconocer, nutrir, celebrar y ayudar a unificar los dones del Espíritu Santo que obran aquí en nuestra comunidad.

El tercer domingo de octubre es el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. El Papa Pío XI instituyó esta celebración anual hace 98 años, en 1926. Esta celebración nos da la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre la importancia del trabajo misionero para la vida de la Iglesia.
