Pastor’s Message

Dear Brothers and sisters,

In the New Testament, Jesus highlights two commandments as the greatest, summarizing the essence of all other laws. The first is to “love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind” (Matthew 22:37). This commandment emphasizes a deep, devoted love for God, encouraging individuals to center their thoughts, emotions, and actions around Him. The second commandment is to “love your neighbor as yourself” (Matthew 22:39), calling for kindness, empathy, and respect toward others. Together, these commandments encapsulate the foundation of a life aligned with divine love, urging believers to honor God fully while fostering a compassionate, interconnected community.

Next Three Weekends: The Christmas Presence Tree

To bring those we love, either living or deceased, close to us during the Christmas season, we will decorate our Christmas tree(s) on the altar with ornaments bearing the name(s) of our loved ones. If this would be meaningful to you, please see the people at the back of the church to submit the name(s) of the person you would like remembered. We will be offering this for the next three weekends. A suggested ten-dollar donation can be paid with cash, check, or credit card for each name. We will use the funds to decorate the altar for the upcoming Christmas season. The tree(s) will be decorated the Friday after Thanksgiving, and Father Dominic will bless them with a special blessing at the masses that weekend. Our church was beautifully decorated last year with poinsettias; we found the sentiment beautiful, but caring for them was overwhelming, so we're hoping this will capture the same spirit.

November 9th: We invite married couples, single men and women, widows and widowers, divorced individuals, and single parents to participate in the Christian Life Program (CFC). Join us on November 9 from 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM as we grow as men and women of God and embrace the vital vocation of raising families grounded in Christian values. Mass will be celebrated by Fr. John Evans at 5:00 PM.
