Dear Brothers and sisters,

As you know, I am away this weekend. I sincerely thank Fr. John Evans and of course our own Deacon Joaquin for covering things in my absence.

Today’s readings invite us to surrender our lives to God with a humble and generous heart, by serving others lovingly and sacrificially. The first reading from the Book of Kings tells the poignant story of a widow who, despite her dire circumstances, offered what little she had to the prophet Elijah. Her generosity exemplifies the call to trust in God’s providence, even in times of scarcity. This message resonates deeply with us as we navigate our own challenges. Let us reflect on how we can open our hearts and lives to serve others, recognizing that true richness lies not in material wealth but in our willingness to give and love selflessly.

In the Gospel, Jesus highlights the importance of sincerity in our faith, contrasting the pretentiousness of the scribes with the humble offering of the poor widow.
